### Comprehension Strategies


### **Re- Read**

When meaning breaks down, go back and read the section of the text again.



#### Make Connections

Think about what you are reading and try to apply it to something you already know.



#### **Read Aloud**

When meaning breaks down, read the text aloud to monitor reading.



### Make Predictions

As you read, think about what might happen next. You will be making inferences and drawing conclusions about the characters and plot.

#### READ AHEAD

If confused, keep reading to see if meaning builds from the text.



# Create a mental image

Create images in your mind to build meaning when reading.



### use Context Clues

If you are unsure about a word, read the sentence to help make meaning.



### Ask Questions

If you ask questions as you read, you will be looking for answers to your questions, and will remember what you read.



## fook at the Pictures

When reading, try to use the pictures to help understanding.



### Mord Skill Strategies

## Re- Read the Sentence

Go back and read the word, sentence, or a section of the text again.



### LOOK FOR THE ROOT WORD

A word that can stand alone/ a base word.



## Break the word apart

Break the word apart into smaller chunks or recognizable words/sounds.



## Stop and think about it.

Stop and take a moment to consider what the word could be... Does it look familiar or like another word you know?



### Read Back and Read Ahead

If you become stuck on a word, you can: 1) skip the word, read on, and then go back to it; or 2) go back to reread.



# Look at the pictures or diagrams

Look to the pictures and diagrams for clues.
