Grosse Isle School is proud to serve 48 students in Grades 5 to 8 this year. Our school is primarily organized into two multi-grade classrooms Grade 5/6 (25 students) and Grade 7/8 (23 students)

We are supported by a dedicated team:

3.75 FTE Professional Staff, including our principal, student support, and teaching staff

4.0 FTE Support Staff, including educational assistants, a library clerk, administrative support, and a custodian

As a small Grades 5-8 school, we take pride in creating a learning environment that is grounded in respect, responsibility, and community.
